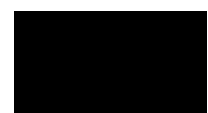
Rural Transport & Dial-a-lift

What you need to know

- There are 11 Rural Community Transport Partnerships in Northern Ireland
- Partnerships may offer services for groups or individuals or both
- Dial-a-lift is a service for people in rural areas – provides door –to-door transport for individuals
- You need to be a member to use services
- You can use your Smartpass on Dial-a-lift to get free or half-fare travel
- All Partnerships have transport accessible to disabled people including wheelchair users and older people
- Drivers have received training in assisting disabled people and older people
- Drivers will help you to get on and off transport
- You must live in rural area to use services

Things to think about

- Check what if services are available in your area
- Check if the services are suitable for you
- Your local Partnership may also know of other transport available in your area
