## **Transport And Your Rights**

#### What you need to know

- Under the Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) disabled people have rights when using transport.
- New buses, coaches and trains meet accessibility standards.
- Eventually all buses, coaches, and trains meet these standards
- Under the law transport providers should not treat someone less favourably because of their disability
- Transport providers must also make reasonable adjustments to make it easier for disabled people to use their services
- Transport providers must allow guide and assistance dogs on their vehicles
- All transport buildings should be accessible to disabled people
- Other services such as information and booking services should be accessible to disabled people
- Under European regulation disabled people have rights when travelling by air and sea.

#### Things to think about

 If you use a large wheelchair, power chair or scooter you may find it difficult or impossible to use the new vehicles
